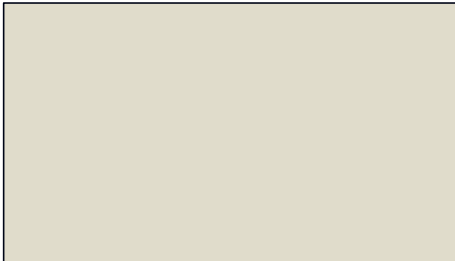

NEW ROADS TO HONOUR DEAF SCHOOL

After intervention from Diana, the new roads on the former Deaf School site will have street names that reflect its history.



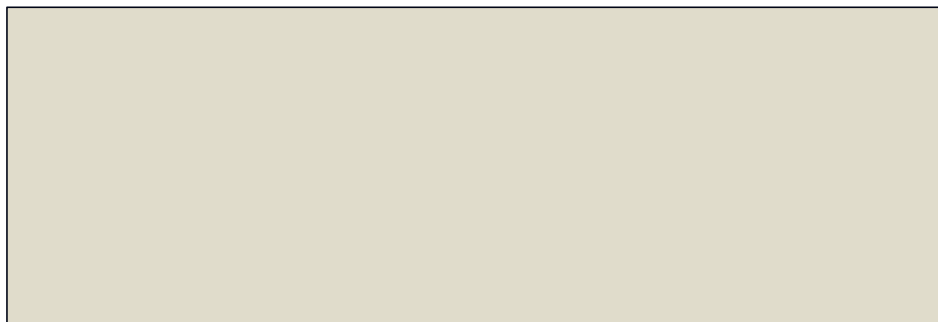

The new roads will be named: Winsor Avenue, Bingham Walk, Chidley Mews, Haden Walk, Dunley Mews and Hippisley Road.

HAVEN BANKS "REGENERATION" SCHEME

Amy & Tess are working with residents to listen to their views about the proposed development of the "Tenpin" site on Water Lane.



Many residents attended a recent exhibition held by the developers and are now organising a community response.

"It's really important that residents put forward their views as soon as possible and especially once the planning application is submitted to the Council. We're working with the planning team and developer to try to secure changes at an early stage."

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Amy has been working with residents of Weirfield Road on the planning application for part of the former deaf school site.



Both Amy and resident, Mrs Powell, spoke on behalf of local residents at the Planning Committee, securing a decision deferral so the entrance onto Weirfield Road and the affordable housing contribution could be reviewed.

Cllr Amy Sparling said:

"Residents put forward a reasonable request, which was backed by the Planning Committee. But the developer is refusing to review the entrance to the site or offer any affordable housing, instead they plan to appeal."
